## **Chaplaincy Thought**



### **CTK 30th Anniversary**



This November is the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of Christ the King Sixth Forms, and we will be marking the occasion with a celebration mass of thanksgiving on 16 November at St George's Cathedral Southwark in the presence of Canon Victor Darlington, Episcopal Vicar for the South East Pastoral Area.

The past 30 years have seen remarkable changes and growth of CTK, starting with one site in Lewisham, the College now has three specialist Sixth Form centres in South East London and Kent. Christ the King Sixth Form College was set up in 1992 through the generous efforts and tireless work of the Diocese of Southwark, Lewisham Education Authority, partner schools and a small group of dedicated individuals. In the early days approximately 650 students attended the College, which is under a quarter of the current size. From the very start, Christ the King established a tradition of excellence for education in South East London. The Chaplaincy played a central role in the College life, with its mission to foster and develop the spiritual life of the sixth form community based on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ.

The CTK Family grew, but the Christ the King way and community spirit remained at its core, as three sixth forms became one Christ the King family, underpinned by our Catholic values.

In 2019 Christ the King Sixth Forms underwent its most ambitious transformation yet. A launch of specialist sites, with unique identities. The Christ the King vision remained the same, with each sixth form dedicated to the education and development of the whole person. Christ the King Sixth Forms have a long tradition of excellence, we take pride in our strong sense of community, our students aim high and go on to become ambitious, confident young adults. We look forward to this new chapter, where Christ the King Sixth forms will continue to grow and to prosper, to build on our Catholic mission and values and to remain an outstanding provider of sixth form education within the local community.

#### **CTK students awarded University Scholarships**

#### worth £15,000 each

The Metric Capital scholarship programme with Christ the King Sixth Forms is in its eleventh year and to date has awarded almost £500,000 in scholarships to hardworking, ambitious, Christ the King students. Metric Capital, works in conjunction with Our Turn Global, a charitable organisation that uses social media to raise awareness about initiatives that have a positive impact on society, to award the scholarship.

The scheme is led by Metric Capital's Managing Partner, John Sinik. John was inspired to create the Metric Scholarship Programme ten years ago, after meeting high performing, aspirational students at Christ the King, who dreamt of going on to University, but faced financial challenges in doing so. Two or three Metric scholarships are awarded every year — usually one to a student attending each of the three sixth forms that make up the Christ the King Sixth Form group.

Two hard-working, talented Christ the King Sixth Form students, have this year each been awarded a University scholarship worth £15,000.

The students, Franklin and Adeola were selected due to their academic performance and after taking part in an interview process, which includes financial means testing. Christ the King Sixth Forms are a group of Catholic Sixth Forms, with three centres in South East London and Kent. Many of the students come from disadvantaged backgrounds and are the first in their family to go to University. Franklin, who is now studying Aviation Engineering at Kingston University London, has had an amazing first term living in Halls of Residence. The scholarship has been a significant help to him as 'it has helped to pay for both his accommodation and books' and he can see when he compares himself with new friends on his course how much pressure, in terms of finances' the scholarship has removed.



#### METRIC CAPITAL PARTNERS

Metric Capital's Managing Partner, John Sinik, says: "Tuition fees are only a part of the expense of going to University. There are living expenses that can be overwhelming for people and ultimately drive their decision not to go. The scholarship plays a key role in allowing the students to pursue their dream of obtaining a University degree".

Christ the King Sixth Forms Executive Principal Shireen Razey, says; "We are delighted that our relationship with John and Metric Capital goes from strength to strength. Our students work incredibly hard, and we are so lucky to be able to reward our students with this unique scholarship opportunity".

On studying, Franklin was keen to point out how much studying at CTK helped prepare for life in Higher Education although he admits 'it is still a big jump!' In terms of Career aspiration Franklin hopes for a career in aviation engineering and then try to become a commercial pilot

Adeola, who is now studying Social Work, has also had a fantastic first term living in Halls of Residence. The scholarship has also been a significant help to her in terms of paying for both accommodation and books. Her advice to anyone looking into scholarships or other financial support is 'to really make yourself know to people and don't be afraid to ask if there is any additional support or help out there.'

As in previous years, the programmes involved a large number of students from all three CTK sites coming together at CTK Emmanuel.

The Fast Track Programme was led by CTK alumnus Trevor Gomes who spoke about his own experiences and how students can "Develop a professional work ethic." During the event Trevor covered topics including the importance of time keeping, personal presentation and the skills needed to work well and succeed in the modern work place.



During the second part of the Fast Track Programme, we welcomed Trevor's Vodafone colleagues to join our students in a 'Digital Bootcamp.'

Working in small groups, students had the opportunity to tackle and come up with solutions for a number of real-world business challenges. The Alternative Pathways Event was run in partnership with award winning charity Unloc. The event helped students to explore the alternatives to Higher Education including Apprenticeships and Entrepreneurship.

Students at CTK Emmanuel designed the "envirohub" for the school's Eco Committee. The space will offer an exciting new indoor and outdoor educational area for students to enjoy learning about sustainability and the environment. Engaging younger students, the new fresh and vibrant space will allow the sixth form to welcome primary school children from the surrounding area to use the facilities, as they help build a more eco-conscious community. While a 'kitchen garden' in the space provides the opportunity for students to grow herbs and produce that will then be given away to people in the local area.
